

1. Do you sweep your school?

Our caretaker, the cleaners, the dinner ladies and sometimes Year 6 sweep the school.

2. Who is your head master?

Our headmaster is Mr. Coulson. He is funny.

3. How do you walk to school.

Most of us walk to school. Some of us drive – but only because we live far away from the school.

4. Do you wash in rivers?

We wash in our bathrooms. Most of us have a bath or a shower every day!

5. Where do you wash your clothes?

We wash our clothes in the washing machine. Every child in Valley class has a washing machine at home.

6. Do you cook your food?

We almost always cook our food. Sometimes we might have a salad, but usually only in the summer.

7. Why do you have ice-like weather?

In England, it gets cold in October until March. We get a lot of rain usually, but sometimes it gets really cold and we get snow and ice. This morning it was very icy on the roads so people had to take care.

8. Do you freeze?

Sometimes we get really cold when there is snow and ice. We wear extra layers to keep warm, like a fleece under your coat. We also wear fluffy hats and warm gloves.

9. How many people die of cold?

We don't know anyone who has died of cold, but our teacher, Mrs Green has heard of a few unfortunate older people who have died of the cold during extreme temperatures.

10. Are there mad people in your country?

We don't have any mad people near our school.

11. Do they give trouble?

We don't have any trouble from mad people! We are lucky, Henley is a very safe town.

12. Do you close your schools for holiday?

We close our school during the school holidays. We have two weeks off school for Christmas!

13. Do you work hard in school?

Most of us work hard most of the time at school! Mrs Green has to keep on at us if we get lazy!

14. How many boys and girls do you have in your school?

We have approximately 130 pupils in our school, roughly half boys and half girls. In our class, we have more girls than boys: we have 10 boys and 20 girls. Lucky boys!

15. Do you have a school uniform?

We have a school uniform. It is yellow and green. We have a school badge which is of a sunrise.

16. How do you sing your national anthem?

We sing 'God save our Gracious Queen' – but not that often. We sung it a lot in 2012 because it was the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the London Olympics.

17. Is your school free primary school as ours?

School is free, apart from lunches and trips and uniforms.

18. Do you have tree planting day in your country?

No, we do not have a tree planting day in the UK. It sounds good!

19. How do you get and cook your food?

We get our food from the supermarket and we cook it at home on the cooker or in the oven or microwave.

20. What crops do you plant?

We grow a lot of potatoes, carrots, tomatoes, cabbages, apples, cucumbers, beans, peas, strawberries, blackberries, corn and wheat.

21. Do you have ox-carts?

We do not have ox carts. Our cows are used just for meat and milk. Their skin is used to make leather products.

22. Do you have a female president?

Our Prime Minister is called David Cameron. He is a man. We do have a lot of women Members of Parliament.

23. Do you have national parks?

We do have national parks where animals and plants are protected.

24. How many school trips do you have per term?

We have two or three school trips per term. Tomorrow we are going to the cinema!

25. Do you have a lake?

We have lots of lakes in our country – we have the Lake District in the north west of the UK.

26. What tribes do you have in your country?

We do not have tribes. We have extended family groups. In Scotland they call this 'a clan'.

27. Do you have dances?

We have disco's at school – we have a big Hallowe'en disco every October. Then we have a family disco in February.

28. What dances do you dance?

We love dancing to pop music. Our favourite at the moment is 'Gangnam Style'. In class, we like dancing to French songs.

29. Do you have rain?

We have LOTS of rain! Last month, there was flooding in our country. Our river in Henley is very high and some homes are full of water.

30. What do you do when it is very cold?

When it is very cold, we might light a fire at home and read or draw. Sometimes it's nice to go for a walk – but we wrap up warm. When it snows, we go sledging down big hills.

31. What seasons do you have?

We have summer (June-September); Autumn (Sep-Nov); Winter (Dec-March); Spring (April-June).

32. Do you all have tin roofs?

We do not have tin roofs. Our roofs are usually made out of slate tiles. Some houses have thatched roofs made out of straw, but not many.

33. Do you have grass to thatch your houses?

Generally, we don't use grass to thatch our houses. Only a few houses have thatched roofs. These are usually the old houses in a town or village.

34. What animals do you keep?

We keep rabbits; fish; hamsters; guinea pigs; dogs; cats chickens and some people keep lizards.
